SMOKEFREE INDOOR AIR CHALLENGE AWARDS

In a year like no other, ANRF stayed the course, capitalized on public health being top-of-mind (especially respiratory health), and remained the go-to source for how to organize a grassroots coalition, even during a pandemic.

We pivoted to online offerings: sharing the music and stories of artists working in secondhand smoke from all over the country, creating resources for coalition building over Zoom, and running virtual training via webinars.

U.S. Tobacco Control Laws Database

has almost **18,000** laws in the current collection in more than 5,800 places. Staff analyzed or reanalyzed **348** laws during 2020 that either increased the number of municipalities with tobacco control coverage or amended existing coverage.

Our data has been used in more than 530 peer-reviewed journal articles, studies, and/or reports, and in multiple NCI monographs and Surgeon Generals' Reports (See our partial

We are also the home of the only national database of smokefree and tobacco-free college campus policies.

colleges and universities are

protected by smokefree policies, covering the entire campus, both indoors and out. 1,975 of them are completely tobacco-free and 1,945 prohibit the use of e-cigarettes anywhere on campus. 986 also prohibit hookah use, and 435 prohibit smoking/vaping marijuana


hospitals are protected by smokefree policies, covering the entire campus, both indoors and out. In addition, 409 nursing facilities are protected by smokefree policies everywhere indoors.
